My mediation and arbitration practice which began in 1989 involves the resolution of disputes throughout the USA with different public municipalities, Native American tribes, private developers, surety and insurance companies, design professionals, contractors and property owners to resolve multi-million dollar disputes involving issues such as: environmentally advanced heating and cooling systems for a large multi-use commercial project using Colorado River water; the design and construction of a new transportation highway; the design and construction of a special

development district improvements within an existing historic city center; and the design, construction and management of a regional multi-city waste water treatment facility.

**b. Statement of Philosophical Approach to Mediation**

Through her application of purposefully facilitative teaming techniques Ruth Franklin assists stakeholders in the creative design of resolution programs identifying and addressing concerns of key stakeholders, assisting the parties in building trust through effective communication, facilitating informed, mutually beneficial and transparent decisions, commitment to agreed upon timelines, establishing measurements of success along with feedback criteria for sustaining and continuously improving the program developed.

As mediator, Ruth Franklin assists the parties in making an informed decision through her application of both facilitative and evaluative mediation techniques. While the process steps to conclusion may differ from case to case, the following description covers a typical two party mediation that occurs after the completion of the project. At the start of the matter, the parties are brought together in a conference with the mediator in order to help create case specific processes that best meet the parties' needs. While the process steps might vary from matter to matter, there is typically advanced meetings with the stakeholders, including an exchange of critical information before the session in order to further each party's risk assessment and case evaluation. The sessions are very dynamic and can include presentations of the factual underpinnings of each party's positions and plenary sessions to clarify the facts and positions taken, followed by the mediator using shuttle diplomacy as the party's break out into separate caucus rooms. Resolution of the dispute evidenced by a signed agreement is the objective of the session and the mediator remains involved through the document creation and signing processes. It is not uncommon that the mediator will continue to work with the parties post-session to further attempts at resolution should the initial session fail to reach closure.
