#### JAMES F. HENRY AWARD

Professor Nancy Hardin Rogers

Professor Nancy Hardin Rogers's accomplishments in the field of ADR are broad and deep. She has been a scholar in the field for decades during which time she has held the Moritz Chair in ADR at Moritz College of Law at Ohio State University, served as Dean at Moritz, Vice Provost for Academic Administration of The Ohio State University and Associate Dean for Academic Affairs. Professor Rogers is a prolific writer in the ADR field, including coauthoring a leading law school textbook in dispute resolution, now in the sixth edition, and a textbook on dispute system and process design. She is a visionary as demonstrated by her leadership skills in the drafting of the legislative framework for the Uniform Mediation Act, which has been enacted in numerous states to date. Professor Rogers has also served as President of the Association of American Law Schools. She is the recipient of numerous prestigious awards.

# CPR Award for Outstanding Contribution to Diversity in ADR

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The National Task Force on Diversity has created an Award for Outstanding Contribution to Diversity in ADR to recognize a person who has contributed significantly to diversity in the alternative dispute resolution field.

Barry's commitment to inclusiveness – specifically in the field of international arbitration but also generally in the legal profession – is a hallmark of his long and impressive career.
