He is also responsible for the company's team of health, safety and environmental lawyers. He previously served as Assistant General Counsel-Litigation for Asarco Inc.

Craig B. Glidden is executive vice president and general counsel of General Motors

LLC where he is responsible for global public policy and corporate sustainability, in addition to his role leading GM Legal. Mr. Glidden was previously executive vice president and chief legal officer for LyondellBasell and senior vice president, general counsel and corporate secretary of Chevron Phillips Chemical Co. Glidden and General Motors were the recipients of CPR's Corporate Leadership Award in 2016.
