He has a PhD in International Law and has published two books in international arbitration: *International Arbitration Ex Aequo et Bono* (New York, Juris, 2016) and *Arbitragem e Equidade* (São Paulo, Atlas, 2012). He is a frequent speaker on the subjects of international arbitration, compliance and antitrust. Mr. Della Valle also occasionally serves as an arbitrator. A Brazilian and Italian citizen, he speaks English, Portuguese, Italian, Spanish and French.

Mr. Kristian, a partner with the law firm Advokatfirmaet Hammervoll Pind AS in Norway, is head of Hammervoll Pind's shipping/offshore department, where his primary focus is the offshore and oil service industry offering assistance in contractual negotiations and disputes. Before joining Hammervoll Pind, he worked with the Norwegian oil company Statoil on procurement and management of frame agreements for maintenance and modifications both on- and offshore. He also served as Statoil's Company Representative in some larger frame agreements with international suppliers to the oil industry. His work consisted of contract management with his main focus on commercial and legal issues related to remuneration, variations, breach of contract, delay and project improvement, among others. He was previously an attorney with the Norwegian law firm Thommessen, primarily focusing on dispute resolution within construction contracts offshore and onshore. He has had a number of mediations and litigated a number of cases for the Norwegian courts and also for arbitration courts.
