Practice focus

He has represented both investors and states in investor-state arbitrations under the ICSID, the ICSID Additional Facility, and UNCITRAL rules; has represented clients in commercial arbitrations under the ICC, ICDR, LCIA, JAMS and UNCITRAL rules; and has served as an arbitrator in ICC proceedings. Mr. Soller has also acted for clients in complex commercial litigation in state and federal court.

Representative clients, cases or matters

- Acting for the former owners of Venezuela's largest coffee retailer in an ICSID arbitration alleging unlawful expropriation, and securing partial award upholding jurisdiction after Venezuela had terminated the underlying treaty.
